**Departmental Scholarship Opportunities**

<b>Scholarships for Agricultural Education Majors</b>
---

The **John B. McClelland Scholarship** is awarded to a sophomore enrolled in Agricultural Education. Students must have completed 30 credits and no more than 59 credits by the end of spring semester. This is an "excellence" scholarship; selection is based on academic achievement (2.75 GPA minimum), leadership, and related experiences.

The **Richard I. Carter Scholarship** is available to: (1) a non-traditional student who has not attended any formal higher educational institution on a full-time basis for at least five years before starting or continuing their bachelor's degree program in Agricultural Education, or (2) Agricultural Education student who has completed at least 75 credits through spring semester towards a double major.

The **C. E. Bundy Scholarships** are awarded to students who have completed 40 credits and no more than 80 credits by the end of spring semester while enrolled in the Agricultural Education curriculum. Selection is based upon financial need, scholastic performance, personal qualities, and leadership.

The **Gruenwald Student Teaching Scholarship** is awarded to an Agricultural Education major who will be student teaching during the upcoming school year.

The **David L. Williams Scholarship** is awarded to an Agricultural Education major who has completed at least 60 credits including spring semester and has completed or is enrolled in 6 or more credits in soil and water conservation courses.

The **Barton Hoxie Robinson Scholarship** is awarded to a student majoring in Agricultural Education. It is awarded to a non-smoking U.S. citizen on the basis of academic excellence.

The **Kenneth R./Evelyn Askelsen Scholarship** is awarded to Agricultural Education majors who are U.S. citizens and have completed at least 60 credits through Spring semester.

The **H. Howard Oak Soil and Water Conservation Scholarship** is awarded to a student who is a resident of the State of Iowa, has completed 60 credits and not more than 75 credits through Spring semester. The students must have a minimum GPA of 2.75 for his/her sophomore year. Selection is based on financial need as determined by the Financial Aid Office, and on those qualities leading to a promising career in Agricultural Education.

The **Gerald F. Barton FFA Officer Scholarship** is awarded to the highest ranking (academically), newly elected Iowa FFA Officer, past district officer or others who are enrolled in the Department of Agricultural Education and Studies.

The **Merle E. Betts Scholarship Award** is awarded to Agricultural Education majors who are full-time freshmen students who plan a career in agricultural education.

The **William Warren Stewart Scholarship** is awarded to a student majoring in Agricultural Education and has the potential for a promising career in Agricultural Education. Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA. First preference is given to those students of Jackson County, Iowa followed by the Southeast and Northeast Iowa FFA Districts, respectively.

The **Richard Meyocks Memorial Scholarship** is available to students majoring in the communications option of Agricultural Education.

The **Gary Wergin Memorial Scholarship Established by the Iowa Bankers Association** is awarded to a student majoring in Agricultural Education Communications Option with at least a 2.5 GPA. Preference shall be given to students who display leadership and participation in school and community activities.

<b>Scholarships for Agricultural Studies Majors</b>

The **Edna Rathman Scholarship in Agricultural Studies** awarded to students majoring in agricultural studies without regard to class standing.

<b>Scholarships for Agricultural Education or Agricultural Studies Majors</b>
---

The **Agricultural Education and Studies Professional Development Scholarship** is awarded to undergraduates enrolled in the Department of Agricultural Education and Studies, who are residents of Iowa, have a minimum 2.5 GPA, and demonstrate financial need.

The **Mark B. Rhea Scholarship for Agricultural Education and Studies** is awarded to a student majoring in Agricultural Education or Agricultural Studies who is a resident of the state of Iowa and has completed at least 90 credits toward a degree. A minimum GPA of 2.75 and demonstrated financial need are requirements of this award. *The scholarship recipient shall be willing to develop and complete a special scholarly project in the AGEDS department in cooperation with a faculty member.*

The **Housh Scholarship for Agricultural Education and Studies** is awarded to undergraduates enrolled in the Department of Agricultural Education and Studies. The recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA, be a U.S. resident, and demonstrate financial need.
